With the help of an attorney, you can include language in your will or trust specifying a gift be made to the Pediatric Cancer Research Foundation (PCRF). There are a number of ways you can include PCRF in your estate plans:

- Specific asset
- Percentage of your estate
- Residue of your estate

Words Matter

When making an estate gift to PCRF, using the correct language is important. The following is sample language that can be used for an estate gift:

I give, devise, bequeath: [Specific asset, percentage, or residual] to the Pediatric Cancer Research Foundation (Tax ID# 95-3772528), a nonprofit corporation as described in section 170 (c) of the Internal Revenue Code, located at 17932 Sky Park Circle, Suite E, Irvine, California, to be used according to the most recently signed gift agreement on file at the Pediatric Cancer Research Foundation.
